

## MINUTES OF THE JOINT BOARD COUNTY COMMISSIONERS DOUGLAS AND LEAVENWORTH COUNTIES, August 29, 1935.

Moved by Earl T. Black that all bids submitted at the Public Letting in regard to the Eudora Bridge be rejected for the reason that all bids exceeded the engineers estimate. Motion seconded by Lon Rush; there being no objections to the motion, motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Chris Schaake that the contract be offered to Mr. J. T. Constant, the lowest bidder in the public letting, at the engineers estimate on a private bid. Motion seconded by Sam Warden; there being no objections to said motion, motion carried.

Mr. J. T. Constant submits a bid of \$28,054.83, which bid upon examination by the engineers of Douglas and Leavenworth Counties was found to be below the engineer's estimate of the cost of construction contemplated.

Moved by Lon Rush, that the bid of Mr. J. T. Constant be accepted subject to the approval of the Highway Commission, seconded by James F. Brass; there being no objections thereto, motion carried.

Moved by Sam Warden that the Chairmen of the joint boards of County Commissioners of Douglas and Leavenworth Counties and the County Clerks of the respective counties are empowered and hereby instructed to sign a contract with Mr. J. T. Constant for the reconstruction of the Eudora Bridge across the Kansas River and that said contract be submitted without further delay, together with the reason for rejection of all bids submitted at the Public Letting heretofore had to the Kansas State Highway Commission for its approval. Motion seconded by Mr. Earl T. Black, there being no objections motion carried.

A special meeting of the Board of County Commissioners was called by the Chairman James F. Brass. At said meeting, all Commissioners James F. Brass, Earl T. Black and Chris Schaake, and County Clerk U. S. G. Plank were present.

County Engineer, E. E. Trueblood discussed with the Commissioners the purchasing of new billet reinforcing bars to meet the A. S. T. M. specifications in 40-0 lengths, bids which had been previously asked for. The companies' bidding and their bids follow:
