## TAX RESOLUTION

Bo it Recolved by the Board of <sup>C</sup>ounty Commissioners of Douglas County, Karses, in regular session assembled this 23rd day of August, 1934, that for the purpose of raising rovenue to defray the expenses of Douglas County for the onsuing taxing year, and for the purpose of reinbursing said County for money expended, there be and is hereby levied on all tangible taxable property in Douglas County, Kanses taxes for the purpose indicated, such taxes being represented by mills and hundredths of mills on the dollar valuation as set out below:
