\$250.45, and that of The Samuel Dodsworth Company of Kansas City \$230.45. Moved by Earl T. Black and seconded by Chris Schaake that the bid of the Samuel Dodsworth Co. of Kansas City, Mo. be accepted. The motion was put by Chairman James E. [unclear] carried, all the Commissioners voting "aye". The County Clerk was instructed to inform the Dodsworth people through its agent, W. H. McKone, that they had been awarded the bid, and to ask them to install the files.

August 7, 1935

The publication of the Douglas County Budget as printed in the Lawrence Democrat under date of July 25, 1935, was again carefully checked. It was moved by Earl T. Black and seconded by Chris Schaake that the Budget as published be adopted. The motion was put by the Chairman and voted. All the Commissioners voted "yes".

Deputy County Clerk, Thomas R. Gerhart, presented a certified list of men who are eligible to receive pay because of labor on the dike during the flood period. By vote, the Board authorized the payment of \$2.00 per day to all men so certified, the same to be paid from the Poor Fund.

August 14, 1935

In the Matter of the hearing for a Petition for the organization of the Douglas County Kaw Drainage District.

ORDER OF THE BOARD

Now, on this 14th day of August, 1935, comes on for hearing the oral application of John W. Brard, Deputy County Attorney, to the effect that Wesley E. Brune be removed as one of the judges, heretofore, appointed by this Board on August 12, 1935, for the reason that the said Wesley E. Brune has since this appointment filed his intention to be a candidate for the Board of Directors of said Drainage District, which fact makes him ineligible to serve as judge at the election of August 23, 1935, and said petitioner further requests the appointment of W. S. Carter as judge to fill said vacancy.

IT IS NOW THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board that the name of Wesley E. Brune be removed as a judge in the election to be held August 23, 1935, and the name of W. S. Carter be substituted.

Moved by Chris Schaake and seconded by Earl T. Black that the above order be approved and by unanimous vote of the Board it was so ordered.

County Engineer, E. E. Trueblood, presented the bills of several firms for a car-load of steel. Said bids were unsatisfactory. Moved by Earl T. Black and seconded by Chris Schaake that all bids be rejected, and that the County Engineer be instructed to readvertise, calling for new bids. The motion was put by the Chairman, and by unanimous vote of the Commissioners it was so ordered.

It was moved by Earl T. Black and seconded by Chris Schaake that E. E. Trueblood be empowered to purchase 2 block iron tanks for Diesel Fuel.

August 23, 1935

TAX RESOLUTION

Be it Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session assembled this 23rd day of August, 1934, that for the purpose of raising revenue to defray the expenses of Douglas County for the ensuing taxing year, and for the purpose of reimbursing said County for money expended, there be and is hereby levied on all tangible taxable property in Douglas County, Kansas taxes for the purpose indicated, such taxes being represented by mills and hundredths of mills on the dollar valuation as set out below:

Road Fund-----	.321
Bridge Fund-----	.683
Special Bridge Fund-----	.024
County Farm and Poor Fund-----	1.00

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas find after full and complete investigation that the maximum levy they are authorized to make for the relief of the poor will not be sufficient to care for those dependant on public charity, therefore,

Be It Further Resolved, that by authority granted in Section 1, Chapter 67 of Special Session Laws of 1933, there be and hereby is levied a tax of 5/8% on all tangible taxable property in Douglas County, Kansas, as an Emergency Relief Fund.

Be It Further Resolved, that for the purpose of paying tuition of pupils in high schools during the ensuing year, there be and hereby is levied on all tangible
