Be It Further Resolved, that for the purpose of raising revenue to maintain sewers, in Douglas County Sewer District No. 1, for the ensuing Taxing year, there be and is hereby levied on all real estate within said district a tax of .35 mills on the dollar valuation.

Be It Further Resolved, that for the purpose of raising revenue for Bonds and Interest, the several taxing districts coming due the ensuing year, and for which the Board of County Commissioners are required to levy, and for the further purpose of reimbursing Douglas County for sewer expended, there be, and is hereby levied on all real estate within said district a tax of .35 mills on the dollar valuation of all tangible taxable property in the taxing district liable therefore.

At a special meeting of the County Commissioners called by the Chairman, James F. Brass, all the Commissioners and the County Clerk were present.

The bills of Paul V. Trovillo and Jewell Arrington, Case-Aides who have resigned and are leaving Douglas County, asked for their August bills for wages--the same were presented by the County Clerk--said bills being \$50.00 each--were passed by the Board and ordered paid. C. H. Hunsinger presented a bill of \$5.00 for towing in and storing liquor cars for several days which bill was disallowed by the Board.

Poor Commissioner, Harold T. Baker, presented the Board with what he called a "Restricted Grocery List" asking that the Board approve this list for use with the Douglas County Relief plans; his suggested list follows:
