A bill will not be allowed for groceries other than those named.

Beginning October 1, 1935, standard county prices are to be used. Those prices will be set by a representative groceries committee, appointed through the facilities of the Morchants Bureau of Lawrence Charber of Commerce; said prices to be approved by the County Commissioners. We will appreciate your cooperation in the restricting of the expenditure of public funds to only plain necessities as listed on this restricted grocery list.

Any store not complying with the restricted grocery list in filling county orders will be removed from the list of approved stress who may receive county orders.

Enclosed arc two copies of the restricted grocery list. One is to be restrained by you for your reference. Please-fill in prices, to be used this month, on items listed on the second copy and return same to this office at once.
