The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, met in regular adjourned session with Chairman James F. Brass, Commissioners, Earl T. Black and Chris Schaake, and County Clerk, U. S. G. Plank, all present.

Bills for wages, labor and materials, and for the maintenance of the Poor were presented, scrutinized, and ordered paid as per allowance record.

Now comes one, J. T. Constant, before the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, filing with the Board his joint contract for the improvement of the Kaw River Bridge at Eudora, Kansas, which contract calls for the payment of \$28,054.83, and also files a statutory bond issued by the American Bonding Company of Baltimore, Maryland, and in addition, thereto, a Bridge Contract Bond executed and issued by the American Bonding Company of Baltimore, Maryland, the first of which is to be filed with the County Clerk of Douglas County and Leavenworth County.

After an examination of said bonds, the Board finds the same in order and in conformity to law.

It is now moved by Earl T. Black that the Chairman, James F. Brass, be authorized to approve by signature the Bridge Contract Bond and the said J. T. Constant be directed to file the statutory bond with the clerk of the District Court in the manner provided by law. This motion was seconded by Chris Schaake; the Chairman put the motion, all three Commissioners voting for the motion and none voting against it; the motion carried and it was so ordered.

At 1:30 P. M. the Relief Committee met with the Commissioners to discuss the situation relative to Case Supervisor. The whole situation relative to the needs of the County and the possibility of Miss Langmaid being continued were discussed and carefully considered. No action of record was taken at this meeting.

The Board adjourned to meet on the 11th day of September, 1935.
