The Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session with Chairman James F. Brass, Commissioners Earl T. Black and Chris Schaake and County Clerk U. S. G. Plank present.

The usual bills for wages, labor and materials and for the relief of the destitute were presented, allowed and ordered paid.

A petition signed by L. A. Nuffer and fifteen others was presented to the Board asking for the location and vacation of a road in Douglas County described as follows:

Beginning at a point about 51 feet N. of the SW cor of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 5- T 13 S R 20 E which point is in the N right of way line of state highway No. 10. Thence N on line about 279 feet to center line of present old road, and Vacate the present old road--Beginning at a point 51 feet N of the SE corner Section 5 T 13 S R 20 E. Thence N on E line of said Section 5 about 279 feet, thence W about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the E right of way line of the N and S road.

This petition was favorably received by the Board and the County Clerk was instructed to make legal advertising of the same and to designate the hour for a hearing as 2 o'clock P. M. November 6, 1935 at the point of beginning of the above description. The above order by vote, all the Commissioners voting "yes".

A Mr. George Murphy who had completed a sentence of 60 days in the County Jail on a liquor charge and who had worked out \$82.00 of a \$200.00 fine, asked that balance of his fine be remitted. A motion made and seconded unanimously voted by the Commissioners ordered the amount remitted.

The application of James M. Williams, T. B. patient for admittance to the State Sanatorium at Norton was received and by unanimous vote of the Board was favorably acted upon. The usual conditions attending the admittance of the patient to the hospital were authorized save transportation to and from Lawrence to Norton were to be paid by one Minnie Lucas.

E. E. Trueblood by unanimous vote of the Board, all members being present, was instructed to get bids on a carload of bridge lumber.

Upon completion of the day's business, the Board adjourned to meet at 9:30 A. M. Saturday, October 12, 1935.

A similar bill against A. G. Banks for rents on machinery early in July, 1933, and in the amount of \$48.00 was referred to the County Attorney with instructions to collect.
