At a called meeting of the County Commissioners of Douglas County, called by the chairman of the Board, all the Commissioners, the County Clerk and the County Engineer were present. The purpose of the meeting was the receiving and opening of bids for car load of Portland cement. The firms bidding and the amounts of their bids follow:

Whereupon, the Board awarded to the Logan-Moore Lumber and Coal Company the contract for one car load of cement at the price of \$2.34 per barrel taking advantage, also, of the 10 per cent discount.

Chairman James F. Brass of the Douglas County Commissioners called the Board in special session for the purpose of discussing the Poor relief set-up as of November 21, 1935. A bulletin had been received at the office stating that the Douglas County Relief Committee had been discharged with honor and that hence forth the Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, will be responsible for the administration of relief. Provision granted, however, for the Commissioners to continue the personnel of the Relief Committee in an advisory capacity if the Board so desires. The new situation was discussed by the members of the Board and the Poor Commissioner, Harold T. Baker.

At the conclusion of the discussion, the following motion was presented by Earl T. Black: Moved that we employ Robert L. Hitchcock of Independence, Kansas, to act as Poor Commissioner and Case Supervisor and that his name be submitted to the KERC of Topeka for approval, said Hitchcock to begin his services at a salary of \$125.00 per month, said services to be continued at the pleasure of the Board of County Commissioners. This motion had a second in Chris Schaaake. The motion being put by the Chairman it was voted, all the Commissioners voting "aye".
