A meeting of the Douglas County Board of Commissioners called by the Chairman James F. Brass, was attended by all the Commissioners and Deputy County Clerk, T. R. Gerhart.

The business of record was the petition of Lillie Ridley asking the vacation of the roads described as follows:

Beginning at a point 20' South of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor on the E line Sec. 32, T 12 S, R 19 E; Thence South along E line Sec. 32, T 12 S, R 19 E, and terminating at the  $\frac{1}{8}$  corner on the E line Sec. 32, T 12 S, R 19 E.

Beginning at the  $\frac{1}{8}$  corner on the E line Sec. 32, T 12 S, R 19 E. Thence SW along the center line Road No. 347. Vacation to include all of Road No. 347 lying in the SE  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 32, T 12 S, R 19 E, and terminating at the intersection of Road No. 347 and the S line Sec. 32, T 12 S, R 19 E.

It was moved and properly seconded that the petition be received and ordered published in the official paper, first publication to be as of December 19, 1935, and the viewing of the road be set for 2 o'clock P.
