The Board of County Commissioners met in special meeting called by James F. Brass, Chairman, with Commissioners Earl T. Black and Chris Schaake, and County Clerk, U. S. G. Plank, all present.

Poor Commission

The purpose of this meeting was to interview the acting Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor, relative to a new set-up of the personnel in the office of the Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor. Miss Robinson presented the Board with the information that the total allotment of funds for employment of office help in the office of Poor Commissioner at Lawrence as coming from KERC amounted to \$250.00 per month only for the months of January, February and March 1936. This necessitated a complete rearrangement of the personnel as now existing. A complete and full discussion of the situation was entered into by the Board and acting Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor, Cecelia Robinson. The net result of the discussion follows: To be dropped from the pay roll and paid in full until December 21, inclusive:
