DEAMER ROAD

WE, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS, Acting under the Laws of 1923, Chapter 68 Article 114, which reads as follows: "PROCEEDING FOR CHANGES IN ROADS. When it is found necessary to layout, relocate, alter, widen or vacate a road or highway for the purpose of eliminating sharp turns or other dangerous places, or for the proper construction of a highway, or for the extension of a bridge or culvert, the board of county commissioners shall be order of said board layout, relocate, alter, or widen a public road and may vacate an existing road. All land required for the laying out widening or altering of a road shall be acquired by the board of county commissioners by purchase or by donation."

We, do hereby order the Deamer County road, in or between Sections 11 and 12 Township 13 S South; Range 20 East, laid out, altered, widened or vacated from 50 feet to 60' for 3/4 and 55' for 1/4 mile and acting as VIEWERS, do hereby order that the route as surveyed under our direction by E. E. Trueblood, County Surveyor, assisted by C. E. Redmond and Ed Duver and Geo. Moorman chainmen, is for the public good and convenience.

Moreover, on file among the Engineer's papers in the County Clerk's office are waivers or releases for all claims for damages to the land adjacent to said roadway by all the property owners owning property adjacent to said road; Namely, the lands are donated for road purposes.
