By resolution approved by the K.E.R.C. and presented by Mildred D. Johnson; Officer Manager: Willfred Eudaly.

By a similar resolution Cecelia Robinson was reduced from Acting Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor to Case Aide at a wage of \$65.00 per month--\$50.00 from Douglas County and \$15.00 from Emergency Relief Funds, effective January 26, 1936.

Chris Schaaake moved and Earl T. Black seconded and all the Commissioners voted "aye" instructing the County Clerk to acknowledge receipt of certain books from the KERC office in Topeka. The identity of the books follows: One Buckram bound book Serial No. 219; Four Paper bound books Serial Nos. 709-710-711-712- Kansas Public Welfare Service 1934 and 895 copies of County Reprints.

The Board of County Commissioners discussed the raise in wages for Mrs. Mildred Le Suer. Moved by Earl T. Black and seconded by Chris Schaaake that the title of County Auditor be conferred upon Mrs. Mildred Le Suer and that her wages for the year of 1936 should be based on a wage scale of 75¢ per hour for time actually employed, said scale to be effective January 1, 1936. The motion was put by Chairman James F. Brass and voted, the vote being "aye" unanimously.
