# COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

## February 18, 1936

As per adjournment of the meeting of February 13 the Board met in special session with all the Commissioners and the County Clerk present. The purpose of the meeting was to clear up some matters of business and especially to decide the matter of County printing for 1936.

A. Mr. G. H. Ransom presented the Board with the thought of purchasing fire fighting equipment. After a demonstration and a discussion of the necessity for such equipment, the Board on motion and a proper vote, all the Commissioners voting "aye", awarded to Mr. G. H. Ransom, an order for 3 one quart "Fyr Fyter" guns at \$10.00 per gun.

At 11 A. M. the various newspapers again presented their bids for County printing, said bids being (a) on the general publications and (b) the printing of delinquent taxes.

For all publications, excepting Delinquent and Final Tax notices, the charge for first insertions will be one dollar per square of 250 ems, and for succeeding insertions fifty cents per square of 250 ems. These publications will appear in the Journal-World.

For publication of Delinquent and Final Tax notices, the charge will be twenty-five cents per description and ten cents per lot, one charge to cover the total number of publications. These publications will appear in the Douglas County Republican.

### THE LAWRENCE DELOCRAT

On all delinquent property both subject to sheriff sale in April and also on the regular 1935 delinquent list in August both of which are published four time we will bid for all issues required fifteencents  $(15 \not/)$  for acre property for each description and six cents  $(6 \not/)$  for each city lot. As aforesaid this includes all four insertions.

For the balance of the official printing we will make the same bid as last year viz twenty-five cents  $(25\varrho)$  per square of two hundred and fifty (250) ems set up on seven (7) point type on the seven point base.

#### THE EUDORA HEWS

For legal publications, county tills, county farm reports, etc.,  $22\phi$  per square for the 1st insertion and  $11\phi$  for each additional insertion.

For the delinquent tax list 20% for each description and 8% per lot.  $\ast$

Black that the Eudora News be awarded the contract for the general publications as per its hid above noted and also be designated as the official paper; that the Baldwin Ledger be awarded the contract for the printing of the delinquent faxes as per its bid as above noted. The motion was put by Chairman James F. Brass and the vote was for the motion Chris Schaake and Earl T. Black; against the motion James F. Brass.

George Harper appeared before the Board asking for relief touching a certain judgment against one F. H. Harper, his brother; his request was disposed of by the following resolution:
