## February 25, 1936

(Because of the breaking of an ice gorge in the Kaw River just mest of the Eudora Bridge on the evening of February 24, 1936 two of the Commissioners and the Engineer from Leavenworth County and all of the Commissioners and the Engineer from Douglas County met at the site of the Bridge at 10 o'clock on the 25th of February to look over the damage done by the breaking of said ice gorge. At 1 P. M. on this day all the above named persons met informally in the room of the County Commissioners of Douglas County for discusson of the present situation. The net result of the discussion is (a) that J. T. Constant who is now doing repair work on the bridge be asked to pour concrete in peer No. 3 the excavation for which is already completed and to bring the peer above the surface of the earth; (b) The matter of straightening the channel immediately west of the bridge to save erosion on the North bank; (c) The possibility of jetties on the North bank. The informal discussion closed with a request of the County Commissioners present that the Engineers make a tentive survey of the present situation and when ready to report to the Board of the two Counties that a meeting be called by the Chairman of the Board of the Engineers of the respective counties for further discussion and more mature suggestions for remedying cur present loss.)

## · March 2, 1936

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Karsas, namely, James F. Brass, chairman, Chris Schaake and Earl T. Black, Commissioners and County Clerk, U. S. G. Plank, were all present. at a regular adjourned meeting this 2nd day of March, 1936.

Bills for wages, salaries, supplies and for the maintanence of the Poor and Destitute were presented, scrutinized and ordered paid as per the allowance record. The matter of the further continuance of the use of the county bridge by the Kaw Valley Interurban Railway company was considered and the County Attorney was asked to begin action in the District Court looking to the cancellation of the contract or easement of said company with the County for its use in crossing the bridge. This instruction was given the County Attorney by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners.

In the matter of handling transients who are on relief passing through the City was discussed and again by unanimous vote, the Commissioners instructed the Poor Commissioner to allow relief on the condition that the applicant first cut a rank of wood, said rank being 8 feet long, 4 feet high and 14 inches wide.

Moved by Chris Schaake, and seconded by Earl T. Black that the County Engineer, and the County Foreman be and are hereby instructed to notify all County Road and Bridge Employees, that lost time either for personal reasons or from sickness through natural causes, will not be allowed on the pay roll in the future. The motion being put, it was so ordered, all the Commissioners voting "aye".

This postition was signed by 75 citizens in the vicinity of Baldwin City. The petition was reviewed as to the necessity for such action at this time and ordered filed.
