The City of Lawrence presented a three-way contract for the installation of two-way radio on police cars. The contract follows:

#### C O N T R A C T

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this 13th day of April, 1936, by and between the City of Lawrence, Kansas, as party of the first part, the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, as party of the second part, and Verne Omer, party of the third part,

WITNESSETH: That, whereas, the City of Lawrence and the County of Douglas are desirous of establishing a police radio system to aid in the apprehension of criminals and the detection of crime and to generally assist in law enforcement in the City of Lawrence and County of Douglas, State of Kansas, and

WHEREAS, party of the third part is a radio engineer and is desirous of installing a police radio system consisting of a fixed station and certain mobile units.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows: That said Verne Omer will install said fixed station for the sum and amount of \$168.00, one-half of which amount in the sum of \$84.00 is to be paid by the City of Lawrence and the other half in the amount of \$84.00 to be paid by Douglas County, Kansas. Said fixed station is to be installed at police headquarters in the City of Lawrence, Kansas. That said Verne Omer is to equip two city police cars with two-way mobile equipment for the amount of \$247.00, the cost of which is to be paid by the City of Lawrence. That said Verne Omer will equip one county police car with two-way mobile radio equipment for the sum and amount of \$123.50, which amount is to be paid by the County of Douglas.

Said Verne Omer also agrees at any time within six months from the date of the signing hereof to equip one or more additional cars with two-way mobile radio equipment for the County of Douglas at the price per car of \$123.50 at the option of said Douglas County.
