IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION  
BY RAYMOND WASHINGTON FOR RELEASE

WHEREAS, The County Attorney of Douglas County has made application for and on behalf of Raymond Washington now confined in the Douglas County Jail by reason of non-payment of a fine assessed against him in the Justice Court of O. J. Lane for the crime of indecent exposure, and

WHEREAS, there is a balance of \$ 582.05 due on said fine and costs which the said Raymond Washington is now unable to pay, and

WHEREAS, the said Raymond Washington is being confined at the expense of the said County and the said County is desirous of relieving itself of said expense,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED on this 8th day of April, 1936 that the said Raymond Washington be now released from confinement from said County Jail with the condition that he shall pay the balance of said fine and costs on or before the 9th day of April, 1936 with power reserved in this Board to cancel this Resolution and to cause the said Raymond Washington to be committed to jail for the further payment of said fine and costs.
