

For .775 acres of land--no damages claimed--none awarded.

For .88 acres of land at unit price of \$60.00--awarded \$52.80, which was, also the amount claimed by John E. Koehler. In addition:

The 58 rods of fence along the east side of this 40-foot right of way will be provided by Clinton Township.

The Board of County Commissioners convened at 9:30 A. M. for the purpose of resolving itself into a Board of Equalization to adjust any discrepancies that may have arisen during the 1936 Assessing period. All the Commissioners were present. The County Clerk was also present. Regular sessions were held from the morning of the 18th until the close of the day, May 28.

The Board of County Commissioners, sitting as a Board of Equalization, adjourned as a Board of Equalization for the purpose of reconvening as a Board of County Commissioners for the consideration of several specific matters of business: These matters were taken up: Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor, Mildred D. Watson and Chief Clerk Leon G. Abele, appeared before the Board with a list of recommendations touching on the personnel of the Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor's office.

Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor, Mildred D. Watson was recommended for a raise of \$25.00 per month to be paid as follows: \$125.00 per month was to be paid from the county and \$25.00 per month to be paid out of the county's allotment of KERC funds, constituting a total salary of \$150.00 per month.

Leon G. Abele was recommended for a raise in salary to \$100.00 per month; \$50.00 per month to come from the county and \$50.00 per month from the KERC fund, constituting a total salary of \$100.00 per month.

Mona Simpson, Case-Aide, Cecelia Robinson, Case-Aide and Guida Burgan, Case-Aide, were recommended for an increase in wages up to \$75.00 per month each; the County to pay \$50.00 per month each and \$25.00 per month for each to come from the KERC funds. Maurice Price was recommended for an increase to \$60.00 per month; \$50.00 per month to come from the county and \$10.00 per month from the county's allotment of KERC funds, making a total of \$60.00 per month.

A resolution removing Dora Taylor from employment as a stenographer, her services to end on June 12, 1936, was presented; a resolution was presented, also, removing Guida Burgan from her position as Case-Aide and from the pay roll as of June 30, 1936. Dora Taylor being removed because of her approaching marriage and Guida Burgan being removed for the purpose of reducing the personnel of the Case-Aide staff.

It was moved by Chris Schaaake that the above recommendations and resolutions be adopted. The motion had a second in Earl T. Black; Chairman James F. Brass put the motion and it was so ordered, all the Commissioners voting "aye".

The bill for \$33.27 for one drum of scrub soap was presented by Mr. Rankin. This bill was presented irregularly to clear up a little misunderstanding on the purchase of scrub soap for the Sheriff's office. On a vote by the Board it was ordered paid.

No further business appearing before the Board of County Commissioners, the Board adjourned to again reconvene as a Board of Equalization.
