

The replaced barn, while being new, was not so large as the old barn. Carefully considering this, the Board felt that to allow the old values of 1934 and 1935 to stand, would be fair to both the tax-payer and to the county. It was, therefore, ordered that no change in the value be made.

Relative to the claim for damages, because of 7 acres sanded on the island in the river just north of Eudora, owned by John H. Schopper. The Board made a careful survey of the claims of the said Schopper for damages, and found that the claim did not come within the scope for damages as defined by the State Tax Commission.

Fritz Meyn appeared before the Board, asking that a revaluation be placed upon his property located on Lots 41 and 43 New Hampshire Street. The claim of Mr. Meyn is that when the Deputy Assessors in 1934 appraised his building, they did so on, what he considered, a false cubic footage. He asked for a remeasurement, and a new value placed upon the findings of the new measurements. Definite action was deferred until the final meeting of the Board of Equalization,, which is from June 9 to June 11, inclusive.

N. W. O'Byrne appeared before the Board in the interest of William Earl Kirker, who has made improvements on his property designated as Lots 23 and 24 Ninth Street, Baldwin City, Kansas. The Deputy Assessor had placed \$2000.00 as additional improvements for 1936. Mr. O'Byrne asked for an adjustment. After due consideration by the Board, he was given a reduction of \$300.00 on the value as returned by the Deputy Assessor.

PETITION FOR AN ENLARGEMENT OF BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF
LAWRENCE.

COMES NOW the City of Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas and petitions the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, state of Kansas, to make a finding as to the advisability of adding certain territory to said City of Lawrence, Kansas; And said petitioner requests that the Board of County Commissioners proceed under this petition in accordance with the provisions of sections 12-501 and 12-502 of the 1933 Supplement to the Revised Statutes of Kansas, 1933.

Said petitioner further states that the territory sought to be added to the City of Lawrence and upon which this petitioner requests the finding is as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point twelve (12) feet west of the center line of Indiana street in the City of Lawrence, Kansas, and on the north line of University Place, an addition to the City of Lawrence, Kansas; thence north three hundred seventy-three and fifty-four hundredths feet (373.54), thence west eleven hundred seventy-nine (1179) feet; thence south three hundred seventy-three and fifty-four hundredths (373.54) feet; thence east eleven hundred
