

WHEREAS, it seems imperative that such action be taken at once, and

It was moved by Earl T. Black and seconded by Chris Schaeke that the above resolution be adopted. The motion was put by the Chairman James F. Brass, and voted; all the Commissioners voting "aye".

Fritz Meyn made his final appearance before the Board, relative to an adjustment on his property designated as Lots 41 and 43, New Hampshire Street. The Board listened to Mr. Meyn and agreed with him that they will appear with him before the State Board of Equalization at its meeting in July.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the drought situation in Douglas County has become serious during the past two weeks, and the farmers are in need of water for their stock.

WHEREAS, the County Commissioners declare an emergency now exists in Douglas County.

WHEREAS, in 1934 and 1935 a number of wells were dug at the expense of the Federal Government, and these wells were capped for any future emergency.
