

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

July 15, 1936

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session with all the Commissioners and the County Clerk, U. S. G. Plank present.

The minutes of all the regular meetings of June and the special meetings of June were read and approved as read. The final bunch of bills for the county and for the maintenance of the Poor were presented, properly scrutinized and ordered paid as per Allowance Record.

Mrs. W. O. Nelson, again, appeared before the Board in the interest of Mrs. Frances Wollenzien. Her plea--the Board should pay Mrs. Wollenzien cash monthly payments instead of the usual grocery allotment.

This question was thoroughly discussed in the presence of the Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor, and disposed of in the following motion:

Moved that for July, 1936, in addition to the \$10.00 grocery order which Mrs. Wollenzien had already received, she be given a grant of \$10.00 for the month of July, and that during each succeeding month, she is to receive \$20.00, which \$20.00 shall be paid her on the first day of the month for which the allowance has been made.

This motion had the proper second. The Chairman, James F. Brass, put the motion and it was voted, all the Commissioners voting "aye".
