Reilly be instructed to communicate with the Attorney-General, Clarence V. Beck, asking for an interpretation of the law relative to the voting of bonds.

A special meeting was called by the Chairman, James F. Brass, to take care of some accumulated business. Members of the Board present were: James F. Brass, Chairman, Chris Schaake and Earl T. Black, Commissioners, and U. S. G. Plank, County Clerk.

The Farm Bureau Agent appeared before the Board, asking for some help for his office during the period of his making Emergency Crop Loans. The question was discussed with the Board, and it appeared that he would need the services of a girl four days a week for a probable period of two months. The County Clerk informed the Board that he might divide time with the County Agent with Miss Davis, who is now working in the County Clerk's office, and such division of time was agreed upon. Miss Davis is to give Monday and Tuesday of each week to the County Clerk's office and the remaining four days a week to the office of the Farm Bureau.

Moved and seconded that the Board authorize the Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor, to purchase some necessary reading supplies as required from the office of the KERC in Topeka. Motion put by the Chairman, James F. Brass and was so voted, all the Commissioners voting "aye".

As a matter of record, we are making mention of a resolution known as No. 301, authorizing a project in Eudora Township under the county's blanket order for projects in the county. The resolution has to do with the surfacing of three miles of township road for which Federal funds are available to \$3090.00 and the sponsors' contribution for \$893.40.
