This being the day for the regular adjourned meeting of the Board, it--the Board--convened at 1:30 o'clock for the consideration of any business that might come up which was strictly county business.

The final list of bills for the county for supplies, wages and for the maintenance of the Poor, ect., were presented, carefully read and ordered paid as per Allowance Record.

Mrs. W. O. Nelson appeared before the Board in the interest of Mrs. Frances Wollenzien and presented in a clear and concise form the extreme needs of Mrs. Wollenzien. The question of when payments were due was a part of the discussion. After careful consideration, the matter was disposed of in the following motion:

Wollenzien

Moved on the recommendation of the County Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor, Mildred D. Watson, that a supplemental grant of \$15.00 be paid to Mrs. W. O. Nelson for Mrs. Wollenzien from the Revolving Fund of the County Clerk, said grant being to care for immediate emergency needs, and that when bills are allowed in September, that Mrs. Nelson be allowed a grant of \$20.00 for Mrs. Wollenzien which will be a grant for the month of August, 1936. Moved further that on each succeeding month at the discretion of the Board of County Commissioners, Mrs. Nelson be allowed a grant of \$20.00 for Mrs. Wollenzien, said grant being always considered as payment for the month immediately preceding the month in which the grant is paid, and moved further that Mrs. Nelson be designated as custodian for the above named grant in the interests of the said Mrs. Frances Wollenzien.

It was moved by James F. Brass and seconded by Chris Schaeke that the motion be adopted and on vote, it was so ordered all the Commissioners voting "aye".

The Board of County Commissioners received John F. Laughlin and all other interested parties, to discuss the matters pertaining to the location of a road described as follows: Beginning at the northwest corner of the southeast quarter of Section 15, T 14 S, R 20 E of the 6th P. M., thence running East on the 1/4 Sec. line one hundred (100) rods.

After considerable discussion, this sort of conclusion seemed to be in the offering, but no definite action was taken. The conclusion is that if the road is built, the county will build a bridge, the land owners will donate the land, and the township will pull the hedge and build the road, with the understanding that the hedge will be divided, equally, among the property owners.

No definite action was taken and this is simply a note of record of what was discussed in the Commissioners' office.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned, subject to call of the Chairman or of the County Clerk.

*Budget
Meeting*

The Board of County Commissioners met in special session in the court room of Douglas County, at 10 o'clock A. M., with all the Commissioners, the County Clerk, Mrs. Marvin LeSuer, County Auditor and the County Attorney, R. B. Stevens present.

This was a regularly advertised public meeting for the consideration of the budget. Some fifteen tax payers of the county appeared. The proposed budget as set up by the County Commissioners, assisted by the County Auditor and the County
