This question was also thoroughly discussed and disposed of in the following motion: Moved by Chris Schaake that Marion Martin, who has been temporarily employed since August 11, be placed on the pay roll regularly and continued at the discretion of the Board at a wage of \$50.00 per month to be paid from the funds of the County. Earl T. Black seconded the motion and the motion, being put by Chairman James F. Brass, it was so ordered by unanimous vote of the Commissioners.

Motion was made by Chris Schaake and seconded by Earl T. Black that the County Clerk be instructed to adknowledge receipt to the Kansas Emergency Relief Committee, Topeka, of one buckram bound, Serial Number 72, and four paper bound, Serial Numbers 742, 743, 744 and 745, copies of "Public Welfare Service in Kansas, 1935" and 1300 copies of county reprints.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned subject to call of Chairman James F. Brass or the County Clerk, U. S. G. Plank.
