

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

Commissioner Earl T. Black moved the adoption of the above resolution, seconded by Commissioner Chris Schaaque, and the roll being called, the following Commissioners voted Aye: James F. Brass, C. Schaaque and Earl T. Black.

In response to a suggestion from the auditor, Mr. French, to the Board of Underwriters of Lawrence, Mr. C. B. Holmes, Frank Banks and Gene Glahn, representing the Board of Underwriters, appeared before the Board to talk with them in detail the coverage of all county buildings and equipment.

It had been suggested by the auditor that we are paying for more insurance than we could possibly collect in the event of any losses. After a thorough discussion of the whole question, the matter was disposed of in the following motion:

Moved by Earl T. Black and seconded by Chris Schaaque that all policies now existing covering the county's property be cancelled and that new policies be written in the sum of \$136,280 under the staggering plan, with policies to be effective as of October 10, 1936; and the said policies be written jointly in the name of the County Commissioners and of the County Treasurer.

The Board polled and Chairman James F. Brass, Commissioners Earl T. Black and Chris Schaaque voted "Aye". Against the motion: None.

Poor Commissioner-Care Supervisor, Mildred D. Watson, appeared before the Board with a project proposal from the Work Progress Administration. The proposal is for the period of seven months from date. The proposal is to furnish materials, to be furnished by WPA, KERC and County, to be converted into bedding, garments, ect. and later distributed to relief clients. In this proposal, the WPA proposes to furnish materials and wages in the sum of \$25,177.72; conditioned upon the county or sponsor, in the furnishing of quarters, materials, transportation ect, to maintain the housing of such project.

Moved by Earl T. Black and seconded by Chris Schaaque that Chairman James F. Brass be authorized to sign all necessary papers in connection with the proposal.

A vote was taken and an affirmative vote was declared.

A Mrs. Ewing from Eudora asked, through Mrs. Watson, that she have a special dispensation for the removing of her teeth.

On motion, properly seconded and voted, Mrs. Watson was authorized to have the work done on the usual basis of pay.

After the conclusion of the above business, the Board took up the regular routine of allowing bills for the county such as wages, materials ect., and some bills for the administration of the Poor, which after being scrutinized, were ordered paid as per Allowance Record.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet at 9:30 A. M. on October 7.
