Several patrons of a road located in Sections 25 and 30, Township 13, Range 19, appeared before the Board, asking that steps be taken for improve-ment. The Board asked the said patrons to meet with the County Commissioners and the Township Board on the 14th day of October for further discussion. Wage int Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor, Mildred D. Watson, presented to the Board resolutions, asking that Marion Martin be given an increase of \$10.00 per month, said \$10.00 to be paid from the Federal Emergency Relief Funds, and that Irma A. Burgert be given an increase of \$10.00 per month, said increase to be paid from the Federal Emergency Relief Funds. Porr Chris Schaake moved the adoption of the resolutions. Earl T. Black seconded the adoption, and on ballot of all Commissioners, it was so ordered, all Commissioners voting "Aye". No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet at 9:30 A. The final allotment of bills against the County were presented, inspected, and ordered paid as per Allowance Record. The Clinton Township Board with persons interested in the road, previously designated as the "Nick Thome" Road, met with the Board of County Commissioners and discussed at length the possibility of improving said road. The discussion closed with the suggestion from the County Commissioners that a petition be pre-pared and presented to the Board of County Commissioners, setting forth specifications as to the improving of the road and securing signatures, designating the amount of contribution by each signator. Nick Thomas Road The matter of the Barker-Kampschroeder, which has simmered for sometime, was finally disposed of upon securing the signature of C. S. Barker to his damage claim under date of October 3, 1936. The final action of the Board of County Commissioners follows: FINAL ACTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ON THE ROAD PETITIONED FOR by Mrs. Effie Kampschroeder and Others: The petition of Mrs. Effic Kampschroeder and others for the establishment of a road being under consideration of the Board for final action, it is determined and ordered by the Board that the public good and convenience does require that said road as viewed, located and surveyed be established. We determine and order the width of said road shall be 40 feet. And it hereby so ordered by the Board and that these proceedings and the report of survey be recorded. It is also ordered that the Trustee of Clinton Township be directed to cause the road opened for public use.
