Mr. Allen French, representing the J. E. Caton Company, Auditors, met with the Board at 9:30 A. M. and reviewed with the Board, his annual report. The whole forenoon was given to the discussion of this report without completing it. Among the several things discussed, only one recommendation was officially acted upon, namely, the recommendation that all receipts for monies issued by the County Treasurer should be countersigned by the County Clerk and upon a blotter, prepared for the purpose, a record shall be kept of each transaction.

Bills were presented by the County Clerk for materials for the county, wages and salaries for the county and for wages of the relief employees, and bills for the relief of the Poor.

These bills were inspected and ordered paid as per Allowance Record.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet at 10 o'clock A. M., November 4.
