At a special meeting of the Board of County Commissioners called by the Chairman, James F. Brass, the following Board members, namely James F. Brass, Chris Schaake and Earl T. Black were present; County Clerk, U. S. G. Plank was also present. Several additions to the adjustment of taxes were added to the list of taxes to be adjusted by the County Clerk, under date of December 16, 1936. After these additions had been made, Earl T. Black moved to allow the new additions and all the others that had been presented to the Board; Chris Schaake seconded this motion. On vote it was so ordered by the Board, all the members of the Board voting aye.

Mrs. Minnie Hausman of Eudora, Kansas, made application for a refund of \$1.50, her application being based on the fact of not having had full exemption and on having been charged with a dog when she owns no dog. It was moved by Chris Schaake that Mrs. Hausman be given a refund warrant in the sum of \$1.50. This motion had a second by Earl T. Black and on vote of all the Commissioners voting aye, the refund warrant was ordered drawn. The items representing the \$1.50 were:
