The Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session at 9:30 A. M., with Chairman James F. Brass, Commissioners Chris Schaeke, and Earl T. Black and County Clerk U. S. G. Plank present.

At 10 A. M. as per request of the County Engineer, a number of truck dealers in the county, presented bids as a basis for furnishing trucks to the county as follows:

The bids were received by the Board but final action on bids was deferred until a later day to give the Engineering department time to make a more complete check on the figures submitted.

The minutes of the regular meetings of December, namely: December 7, 9, 12 and 16, and the special meetings of December 22 and 30, were read. Several corrections were suggested by members of the Board, and with the understanding that said corrections be made, the minutes were approved, as read and corrected.

Bills for the county, consisting of material bills and wage bills as against the County Poor Farm were presented, scrutinized, and ordered paid as per Allowance Record. Only smaller bills for Public Assistance in the sum of about \$600.00 were allowed at this meeting.

Relative to bids for gasoline for the county for the year 1937: The bids of the 13 oil companies were the same. The Independent Oil Company (F Wiedemann) was awarded the contract for the year, with the provision that the contract may be abrogated at the pleasure of either party on thirty day's notice. This contract was awarded by the usual motion, second and vote of the Commissioners.
