By motion regularly seconded and voted, the chairman was authorized to sign the personnel and salary approvals order of the K. E. R. C.--Poor Commissioner for January as submitted by the Poor Commissioner.

At this point, time was taken out for the reorganization of the Board of County Commissioners for 1937. Following the usual procedure with motions and seconds and voting, resulted in the naming of Chris Schaake as Chairman and Earl T. Black as Vice Chairman for the year 1937.

Following the reorganization of the Board, the appointive officers were considered. This consideration resulted in reappointing Mrs. Mildred D. Watson as Poor Commissioner Case Supervisor; Mr. E. E. Trueblood, County Engineer; Mr. John F. Netsker, County Farm Superintendent; and Mrs. John F. Netsker, Matron of the County Home for the ensuing year, each at his and her present wage scale. Said appointments subject to the legal procedure in making appointments.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet at 10 A. M. January 14, 1937.

As per adjournment under date of January 13, the Board of County Commissioners with the County Clerk met at 10 A. M.

Mr. Harding of the Resettlement Office and his assistants met with the Board to discuss the merits of applicants for relief grants. The names of a number of clients were presented to the Board and the action that Mr. Harding and his assistants had taken in the various cases were approved by the Board.

Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor, Mildred D. Watson, met with the Board, outlining her plans for relief gardening and the canning of products from the gardens for 1937. She informed the Board that the set-up for such work would be very similar to the set-up that worked so successfully for 1936.

The Board concurred in her suggestions and gave to Mildred D. Watson, its approval.
