And whereas, the contractor has agreed to do this repair work at the same unit price.

And whereas, said joint Board of County Commissioners of Leavenworth and Douglas Counties are desirous of using the funds allocated by the PWA on the Kaw River Bridge Project at Eudora, Kansas for the repair of said old jetties.

Now, therefore, be it resolved of the Board of County Commissioners of Leavenworth and the Board of the County Commissioners of Douglas County that the repairs completed on the Eudora Bridge, Eudora, Kansas contract No. 1, Docket No. Kansas 1294--RS be accepted and the contractor be relieved from any further liability on the work completed on said jetties under said contract. Be it further resolved that the County Engineer of the respective counties be instructed to prepare plans for the needed repair work on the old four existing jetties and submit the same to the State Director of the Public Works Administration for approval as a change order.

Passed this 19th day of January, 1937 by the County Commissioners of Douglas County and Leavenworth County, setting as a joint board for consideration of the Eudora Kaw River Bridge Project.

Chairman Chris Schaeke of the Douglas County Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, called the Board members and the County Clerk in a special session at 10 A. M. All the Commissioners and the County Clerk responded and were present at the said meeting.

C. C. Stewart, representing the Kansas Public Service Company, appeared before the Board, asking for a renewal of a certain contract which had been entered into between the Board of County Commissioners and the Citizens Light, Heat and Power Company, under date of December 25, 1916. Said renewal of contract was carefully considered; whereupon, Attorney C. C. Stewart presented the following resolution for ratification:
