At a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, the following commissioners, Chris Schaake, Chairman, Earl T. Black and James P. Brass, Commissioners and U. S. G. Plank, County Clerk, were all present.

More bills for the relief of the Poor were presented, scrutinized and ordered paid as per Allowance Record of even date.

Mrs. Mildred D. Watson, Poor Commissioner-Care Supervisor, appeared before the Board, asking that a small amount of wood be granted the colored WPA Recreation Center at 18th and Tennessee Streets. The Board, with the proper motion, second and vote, authorized Mrs. Watson to allow them one-fourth cord wood. Mrs. Watson, also, asked that Mrs. Carrie DeShield be paid for her services in the Relief Office by voucher rather than by Relief Order. This grant was authorized by the Board.

The Board of County Commissioners, by ordinary motion and second, authorized the issuing of grocery orders up to \$300.00 to such grocery stores carrying and distributing commodity supplies.
