be designated as township roads. The three petitions were in the same form and signed by the same persons, all interested property owners. The descriptions of the three sectors follow:

Beginning at a point in the center line of West Hills Parkway, 456.8 feet S and 363.1 feet W of the NE cor of NE_{1/4} of SW_{1/4}, Sec. 36, T 12 S, R 19 E, which point is in the west end of present concrete pavement, thence in a westerly direction along center line of West Hills Parkway, which has been laid out for a street in West Hills platted district, a distance of about 300 feet to intersection with the East line of Emery Road.

Beginning at a point in the N line of NE_{1/4} of SW_{1/4} of Sec. 36, T 12 S, R 19 E - 363.34 feet W of above described corner. Thence S along center line of a 25 foot street, 375 feet to N line of Ambridge Place Street, thence continue in a southeasterly direction along center line of High Drive Street about 500 feet to intersection with W line of Emery Road. Total length about 875 feet.

Beginning at a point in the center line of Stratford Road, 1023.5 feet S and 442 feet W of the NE cor of NE_{1/4} of SW_{1/4} of Sec. 36, T 12 S, R 19 E, which point is in the W end of the present concrete pavement. Thence W along center line of Stratford Road, which has been laid out for a street in West Hills platted district, a distance of about 346 feet to intersection with the East line of Emery Road.

These petitions were discussed by the Board with the County Engineer, and the County Clerk was directed to give official notice through the official paper of the time and place for the hearing.

For clarification purposes, the title of our voucher "County Farm and Poor Fund" was changed to read "County Poor Fund".

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet at 10 o'clock A. M., February 6, 1937.
