

March 6, 1937.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session with all the Commissioners and the County Clerk present.

More bills for wages and materials for the county and more bills from the Relief Office were presented to the Board for its scrutiny and passage. Said bills were allowed and ordered paid as per Allowance Record.

The County Clerk presented the following resolution which designates the bank to be used as a depository for the funds of the Clerk of the District Court for his present term. The resolution follows:

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THAT JOHN CALLAHAN, CLERK OF THE DISTRICT COURT OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS DEPOSIT ALL MONEY RECEIVED BY HIM IN HIS OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS THE CLERK OF THE DISTRICT COURT IN THE LAWRENCE NATIONAL BANK OF LAWRENCE, KANSAS.

Whereas, under Section 9-303 of the statutes of Kansas of 1935, it is necessary that the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, designate a depository for all moneys which are paid to the Clerk of the District Court of Douglas County, Kansas. Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners in meeting duly assembled that John Callahan, Clerk of the District Court, Douglas County, Kansas deposit all public moneys received by him in his official capacity in the Lawrence National Bank of Lawrence, Kansas and the said Lawrence National Bank of Lawrence, Kansas is hereby designated by said Board as the depository in which said moneys shall be deposited by the Clerk of the District Court of Douglas County, Kansas.

Dear Sir:

The Board of County Commissioners, Douglas County, in regular session, March 6, passed the following resolution:

WHEREAS, great need exists for legislation for the conservation of natural resources of the State of Kansas, both land and water for the prevention of soil erosion, by impounding and retarding water in streams for the construction of reservoirs, ponds, and lakes and for the establishment of other flood protection works and to otherwise provide for the systematic utilization of land and water.

AND WHEREAS, there is need for the creation of political subdivisions which can sponsor such programs and enter into contracts for their promotion with the government of the United States and agencies thereof.

AND WHEREAS, there is not at this time provision for the creation of such subdivisions in the State of Kansas.

AND WHEREAS, there is now before the State Legislature certain bills (House Bill 185 and Senate Bill 114) which make legal provision for the establishment and operation of three land and water conservancies districts within the State of Kansas.

NOW THEREFORE, this Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, hereby goes on record as favoring the passage of this legislation in the form generally outlined in the above mentioned bills.
