	The Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session this 14th day of April with the following persons present: Chairman Chris Schaake, Commissioners Earl T. Black, James F. Brass and County Clerk T. R. Gerhart.
	The final bills for the county and for the relief of the destitute were presented, scrutinized and ordered paid as per Allowance Record with the exception of two claims, namely: The claim of Joe Candreia for wages amounting to \$21.00 was disallowed due to agreement set forth in the Commissioner's Record under date of March 6, 1937. The Missouri-Kansas Chemical Corporation claim of \$10.00 for supplies for the Sheriff's Office was also disallowed because said supplies are to returned to the company by the Sheriff.
	The Citizens Committee of Public Committee composed of Mrs. C. D. Clark, representing the Public Welfare Group, Mrs. Raymond Schwegler Jr., representing the League of Women Voters, Mrs. Ed Anderson, representing the T. B. Association, Mrs. Fred Isaacs, representing the Red Cross and Mrs. Mildred LeSuer, representing the County Board, appeared before the Douglas County Board of Commissioners for th purpose of discussing the possibility of establishing a County Health Unit for the county of Douglas.
	Mrs. C. D. Clark, acting as Spokesman for the group, presented information and reasons for the setting up of such a unit, as advantageous and beneficial to the county.

The advantages of the project were thoroughly discussed and considered. Definite action on the matter was deferred until a more thorough investigation of such set-up could be gone into by the Board.

House Bills on Social Security Act and Licensing the Sale of Malt were read and thoroughly discussed by the Board, Mrs. Mildred D. Watson, Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor and Mrs. Mildred LeSuer, County Auditor.

Mayor Alfred A. Lawrence, City Clerk A. E. Woestemeyer and City Attorney Geo. Melvin composing a committee from the City, met with the Board of County Commissioners and County Attorney Chas. A. Springer to discuss the matter of setting up a basis for the same license fee for the sale of cereal malt beverages, the lawful sale which will become effective the first of May, 1937.

The problem of an uniform license fee for the City and County was discussed thoroughly but no official action was taken until further consideration could be taken of the matter.

Forrest A. Jackson, Attorney, representing LaVerne White, appeared before the Board relative to a tax grievance submitted in behalf of said LaVerne White

The request for adjustment of taxes on property owned by petitioner was taken under advisement and further consideration of the matter was deferred until a later date.

Miss Cecelia Robinson, Case Worker, representing the Case Worker's Department of the Relief Office, made an informal request for an increase in wages for the members of said department.

She was advised by the Commissioners that her request would be given due consideration by the Board.

Two members of the League of Women Voters and Mrs. Mildred LeSuer came before the Board for the purpose of gaining information in regard to the County government. The methods of County Government were discussed.
