The Board of County Commissioners met in special session, said special session having been called by the Chairman Chris Schaake, with all the Commissioners and the County Clerk present.

A small batch of claims not passed on at the regular meetings was presented to the Board for its scrutiny and passage. The said bills were allowed as per Allowance Record of even date herewith.
