At the first regular meeting for the month of May, held this 3rd day in the chambers of the Commissioners of Douglas County in the Court House, the following persons were present: Chairman Chris Schaaake, Commissioners Earl T. Black and James F. Brass and County Clerk T. R. Gerhart.

Mildred D. Watson, Poor Commissioner-Case Supervisor, and Leon G. Abele, Chief Clerk conversed with the Board in regard to the depletion of funds for the relief of the Poor and the problem of allowing claims for groceries and rents for the destitute for the April bills from the present funds in the County Poor Fund.

The following persons, namely: C. C. Stewart, Attorney, M. H. Penny, Contractor for Crescent Road Project, B. M. Babb Engineer of said project, and E. E. Trueblood, County Engineer came before the Board to discuss the matter of widening Crescent Road. M. H. Penny reported that the paving of said road was practically all finished with the exception of the 1146 feet to be widened from 25 feet to 30 feet. The question before the Board was the matter of the displacement and replacement of the sidewalk on the north side of Crescent Road, so that said sidewalk will conform with the grade of the street.

In order that all persons interested might be present, a meeting was called for Wednesday May 5, at 9:00 A. M., for further discussion and probable disposition of the matter.

The Commissioners informed Mr. Penny and others that they would view the said Crescent Road at 1:30 of this day.

The Board discussed with Mildred LeSuer, County Auditor about the pending bond issue for \$20,000.00 and the payment of expenditures of administrative cost and expenses of relief.

It was decided that before the County paid the bills for poor relief other than administrative, all tax distributions be made as of May 1, 1937, to determine actual cash balances.

Allen French, Auditor, reported to the Board of County Commissioners, A. M. Gardner, County Treasurer and Mildred LeSuer, County Auditor, that the security furnished by the various banks, designated as Depositories for the County funds, does not conform with Chapter 75, Laws of Kansas, 1935 (9-305), in that such security does not protect the County Treasurer's deposits in said banks at any one or at all times.
