No definite action was taken on the matter.

Mr. Carman Payne, Salesman for the Firman L. Carswell Manufacturing Company appeared before the Board and County Engineer E. E. Trueblood in an effort to place a sale with the County Board for a cattle pass constructed on the new arch plan.

Claims against the County for wages and materials, and claims from the Relief Department were presented to the Board by the County Clerk, carefully scrutinized and ordered paid as por Allowance Record.

Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Metsker discussed with the Commissioners the renovating job and its progress at the County Farm.

The Pcor Commissioner-Case Supervisor, Mildred D. Watson, presented a requisition and resolution for yarn from the KERC, for the making of sweaters by the sewing room project under **W**PA, for the use of the relief clients in Douglas County. The resolution follows:
