In a regular adjourned meeting this 13th day of May, 1937, the Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, assembled in the chambers of said Commissioners in the Douglas County Court House, with all the members of the Board, namely: Chris Schaake, Chairman, Earl T. There appeared before the Board Attorney C. C. Stewart, representing the petitioners for the improvements in the paving, curbing, grading and drainage

A resolution prepared by Mr. Stewart in regard to authorization Contractor, for the widening of said road, was submitted to the Commissioners for their consideration and passage. The resolution follows:

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WHEREAS, a petition has heretofore been filed asking that the East 1146 feet of Crescent Road as heretofore described, be improved by making the width of the paving 30 feet in place of 25 feet; that this Board adopted a resolution providing for such widening; that the same has been published in the official county paper according to law, and that 20 days have elapsed since the date of the last publication thereof and no protest has been filed, protesting against such widening,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, authorize M. N. Penny, with whom it has already contracted for the improvement of such Road and the furnishing of materials therefor, to pave such part of said Road to a width of 30 feet with **re-enforced** concrete, including integral curb, together with grading and drainage, in place of 25 feet, as originally provided for, all at the same unit cost as the bid heretofore made by him and accepted by this Board.
