

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

May 22, 1937.

The Board of County Commissioners, sitting as a Board of Equalization met this day in the chambers of the said Commissioners, with Chairman Chris Schaake, Commissioners James F. Brass and Earl T. Black and T. R. Gerhart County Clerk present.

No business for equalization came on before the Board, so they adjourned to reconvene as a Board of County Commissioners to carry on county business.

Harold A. Beck, Register of Deeds, came before the Board with the report that the Register of Deeds Office is very much in need of a new Deed Index. He also pressed the immediate need of a Blank Deed Record. The Board issued authority to the Register of Deeds to purchase the above named books.

A resolution was submitted by A. B. Mitchell, Attorney, to free Jess Cole, now confined in the county jail for violation of the liquor law, for the county to remit the balance of said Jess Cole's fine which had not been worked out by labor, upon payment of the cost by Cole, himself.

R E S O L U T I O N

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners in regular adjourned session this 20th day of May, 1937, that the application of Jess Cole, heretofore filed with the County Clerk of Douglas County, Kansas, be granted upon the following conditions:

That the Sheriff of Douglas County, Kansas, is hereby authorized to release the said Jess Cole upon the payment of sixty-five dollars (\$65.00) cost, and that portion of the fine imposed by Milton P. Beach, Justice of the Peace, which has not been paid by the labor of the said Jess Cole, is hereby remitted upon the payment of the cost aforesaid.

The general information and instructions as set out in the bulletin regarding the above named assistance were read and discussed by the persons present.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet at 9:30 A. M. May 24, as a Board of Equalization.

The Board of Equalization met this day with all the Commissioners and the County Clerk present.

A Mr. Coldsnow, representing the Home Dairy Company of Kansas City, Mo., came before the Board in regard to the valuation on attached machinery to a building at Eudora that was formerly used by the Eudora Dairy Company. The building is no longer in use, and Mr. Coldsnow asked for a reduction of the value which now stands on the building.

The disposition of the above matter was deferred until a later date.

Attorney Forrest A. Jackson, LaVerne, ^{white} Petitioner and Mr. Larkin, Building Inspector, came before the Board to discuss the question of zoning of the house on Lot 125, Rhode Island Street. The argument was that since the house is now changed into a residential place, it can never again be zoned for business, hence it is one reason why the valuation on said house should be reduced.
