A. M. Gardner, County Treasurer and Mr. Clarence Hubbard, County Treasurer of Allen County came before the Board and discussed with them the new set up to handle the new certificate of title law.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned as a Board of County Commissioners to meet again as a Board of Equalization May 25.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, do hereby request that the State Highway Commission of the State of Kansas, take over and maintain as a state highway, the following described read:

Beginning at a point (Midland Kansas) on Highway K 10, thence north along the regularly laid out and main-tained County Highway to a point in Jefferson County, Kansas, where said highway connects with State High-way K 16--at a point 25 miles west of McLouth, Kansas; a distance of approximately 12 miles. Road is also known as Wellman Road.
