The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, met the second day of July, 1937, in a special meeting called by Chris Schaake, Chairman, to convene as a County Social Welfare Board in order to carry on a meeting with Mrs. Golda Zook, Miss Lulu Busby and Mr. Eddy, a committee from the State, Mrs. Mildred D. Watson, County Director, Leon G. Abele, Chief Clerk, Cecelia Robinson, Maurice Price and Marion Martin, Assistants in the Welfare Department, Charles A. Springer, County Attorney and County Clerk T. R. Gerhart.

The purpose of the meeting was to obtain information and tentative suggestions on the Social Security set-up. Mrs. Zook gave a detailed discussion on different phases pertaining to Social Security.

A discussion on the authorized forms as prepared for the business and financial part of the set-up, was gone into by Mr. Eddy and details of same were explained thoroughly.

The discussion coming to a close, the Board adjourned subject to the call of the Chairman or County Clerk.

## July 6, 1937.

At the first regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, for the month of July, 1937, all the Commissioners, namely: Chris Schaake, Chairman, Earl T. Black and James F. Brass, Commissioners, and T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk were present.

County Engineer, E. E. Trueblood discussed with the Board the matter of operating the County Wells in Douglas County, because of the drought emergency at this time. There was a general discussion but nothing definite was decided.

Mr. Arthur Richards and Mr. Joe Marrison appeared before the Board, present-ing a petition requesting that the Board of County Commissioners furnish a tank and an engine for the Marrison well, so that members of that community may be able to secure sufficient water for their stock during the drought season.

The petition was taken under consideration.

Mr. Seth Fenton and Mrs. Grace Stevens came before the Board to discuss the matter of a road petitioned for by Lrs. Stevens. The Board informed the above named persons that as yet no action has been taken on the petition.

Claims against the County for salaries, wages and materials and claims from the Social Wolfare Department were presented to the Board by the County Clark carefully scrutinized and ordered paid as per Allowance Record.

City Engineer B. M. Babb presented claims, representing estimated amounts M. N. Penny Construction Company - - - - \$4,209.76 B. M. Babb, Engineer + + - - - - - \$4,209.76 C. C. Stewart - General manageri Services connected

Total---- 44,880.10

Moved by James F. Brass, seconded by Earl T. Black, that the above mentioned claims be allowed and recorded for payment. The Chairman put the motion, and by unanimous vote of the Board, it was so ordered.

Attorney C. C. Stewart, representing the petitioners for the improvements in the paving, grading and drainage of Strong Avenue and of Grescent Road, appeared before the Board in the interest of said petitioners. He submitted to the Board for its approval the following resolution:

## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, has herotofore authorized the making of certain improvements on the paving, curbing, grading and drainage of Strong Avenue and of Crescent Road, being roads adjacent to the City of Lawrence, in Douglas County, Kansas, the cost thereof, other than that paid from funds granted by the United State of America, to be obtained from the sale of bonds of Douglas County, Kansas, and

WHEREAS, estimates have now been submitted for additional work done in the total sum of \$4,880.10, for which, payment should now be made.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, issue and sell a temporary note under authority of G. S. 10-123 in the sum of \$4880.10 for the purpose of obtaining money with which to pay bills now due on account of said improvements.
