

A delegation consisting of three men, Mr. John L. Banks, Mr. Cole and Mr. Douglas, of Lecompton Township submitted to the Board a petition for the necessary equipment to operate a County Well located in Lecompton Township.

After considerable discussion, the Board gave a written order to the County Engineer to present to the Kansas Electric Power Company, to install the necessary equipment to make connection for pumping for Lecompton Township.

Ralph Colman, Treasurer of Kanwaka Township and County Engineer E. F. Trueblood appeared before the Board with a prepared resolution authorizing Kanwaka Township to work under the County Blanket Project.

James F. Brass moved that Kanwaka Township be permitted to operate under the County Blanket. Earl T. Black seconded the motion and on vote put by the Chairman Chris Schaake, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

Joe Smith, new employee on County Roads was in, in regard to the clarification of the amount of wages, etc. that he was to receive from the County for his services as Patrolman on County roads. Mr. Smith was informed that his wages would be the same as that customarily paid to new employees in this line of work for the County.

Clifford Harding from the Resettlement Office came before the Board requesting additional office space because of an addition to the personnel of the office. It was suggested by Mr. Harding that the north end of the corridor on the Second Floor could be set apart from the rest of the corridor by a railing or low petition; said space would give ample room for two workers.

The above request was granted by the Board of County Commissioners.

The Board of County Commissioners adjourned as a Board of County Commissioners to reconvene as a Board of Social Welfare in order to carry on business brought to the attention of that Board.

Mrs. Mildred D. Watson, County Director, Mrs. Mildred LoSuer, County Auditor, and Leon G. Abele, Supervisor of Business and Finance, appeared before the Board to discuss several matters pertaining to the Social Welfare Work.

The Board approved, at this time tonsilectomies for needy children whose cases were submitted by Mrs. Watson.

It was moved by Earl T. Black and seconded by James F. Brass that the Board of Social Welfare accept the following:
