In regular adjourned session, there assembled at 9:30 A, M., in the chambers of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, a majority of the members of the Board and the County Clerk.

Mr. George Hedrick and Mr. Art Weaver, members of the Lone Star Lake Association met with the Board to discuss the disposition of the Lone Star Lake. A general discussion was gone into but nothing definite was decided at this meeting.

Mr. Morris, Bond Salesman, was in, in regard to the County issuing bonds for Lone Star Lake. The Board informed Mr. Morris that as yet, the County was not the Lone Star Lake. The in line for a Bond issue.

A Mr. Maichel came before the Board to determine what equipment the County would furnish for the Strahan Well for the pumping of water. A petition signed by property owners in that community was submitted to the Board. Relative to Mr. Maichel's request for a new belt for the engine of said well, the Board authorized the purchase of same.

County Engineer E. E. Trueblood reported that the repairing of the Courthouse roof as contracted for by Olmsted Brothers is nearing completion. He also stressed the need of additional repairs for other parts of the roof, and stated that the repairs needson the flat roof would cost approximately \$45.00; for the painting Additional Repairs the flashes approximately \$30.30.

The Board considered the above mentioned repairs a necessity and approved the same, to be carried out under the direction of the County Engineer.

Mr. Rappard appeared before the Board in regard to the fixing of the pump on the County Well about 12 miles East of Globe, so that the farmers in that community may be able to secure water from the well for their stock.

At this hour of 11 A. M., bids for a carload of oridge lumber for the County of Douglas were received and opened by the Board.
