The Commissioners carefully scrutinized said bills and allowed them as per Allowance Record with the exception of the claim of Dr. Louis A. Zimmer, County Coroner for investigations; the claim of the K. U. Department of Entomology per-taining to bees and an old claim of Dr. H. T. Jones for investigations made during his term of office as County Coroner. All above mentioned bills were disallowed because not legal claims.

Mr. Deal Six, County Agent, made a request to the Board for a girl for one day a week to take care of the feed and seed loans at his office, beginning about the first of August.

The Board will give the matter further consideration.

The bindwood meeting was held at this time with a delegation of representatives from the different townships of the County and several County officials and interest-ed parties. Deal Six, County Agent, acted as spokesman at the meeting and explained in detail the bindweed and its menance to the crops of the farmer etc.

The Board adjourned to reconvene as a Board of Social Welfare.

County Director, Mildred D. Watson, came before the Board to confer with said Board on several matters of County Welfare business.

The need for the extraction of teeth for a Mrs. Hendricks, was placed before Board. The Board gave Mrs. Watson their approval for the medical work. the Board.

Chairman of the Board signed an approval for each worker in the County Social Social Welfare Department, said approval to be attached to each application and submitted to the State.

A resolution pertaining to the payment of administrative expense was passed by the Board:

WHEREAS, it appears that the Kansas Emergency Relief Committee will be largely liquidated by August 51, 1937, and

WHEREAS, it appears that Douglas County will recoive no more funds for administrative purposes for paying administrative salaries for the Douglas County Relief Administration from the K. E. R. C., and

WHEREAS, it will be neessary for the Douglas County Social Welfare to pay all administrative expenses in carrying out the provisions of the Social Security law being House Bill No. 557, and

Hulfore Personnel WifEREAS, said law provides that the County Board of Social Welfare shall employ such employees as in their judgment may be needed to carry out provisions of said act and shall prescribe the duties and compensation therefor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED of the said Board of County Commissioners sitting as a Board of Social Welfare for said County that all of the administrative expenses incurred in the administration of Social Welfare in Douglas County be paid out of the Douglas County Poor Relief Fund for the month of July and each month thereafter.
