RESOLUTION

WHEREAS: the Kansas Emergency Relief Committee has on hand, certain amount of pumping equipment at their warehouse in Topeka available for lease,

WHEREAS: the County Commissioners of Douglas County have declared a drouth emergency exists in Douglas County,

WHEREAS: Douglas County has five new wells not equipped with pumping equipment.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that we, the Douglas County Board of Commissioners in regular session assembled this 16th day of July, 1937, do approve the requisition for the following pumping equipment:

- 2 Fairbanks-Morse 1 1/2 HP engines & jacks
- 1 Fairbanks-Morse 1 1/2 HP engine
- 1 Pump Jack
- 3 Stover Force Pumps
- 3 1 1/2" gate valves
- 10 1 1/2" pipe couplings
- 100 ft. 1 1/2" galv. pipe

The following resolution pertaining to W.P.A. projects, was submitted to the Board:

July 16, 1937

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the WPA projects were temporarily closed upon recommendation of the Re-employment Office, and

WHEREAS, the said Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, have heretofore passed a resolution recommending that said projects be closed until the then present need for labor in the harvest fields was supplied, and

WHEREAS, it now appears to said Board that need of such labor has been supplied and that a large number of men formerly employed on WPA projects will be out of employment and in dire need of work relief.

WHEREAS, the July quota for Douglas County WPA is reported as being 111 men where formerly there was employed 247 men working on WPA projects in Douglas County which number was laid off or left of their own volition in order to supply the labor needs for harvest in this County, and

WHEREAS, there are 576 men certified eligible for WPA work in this County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas that all WPA projects in Douglas County heretofore closed be reopened July 19, that work be available for the 247 men who were formerly working on said projects, and

That the August quota be given the 19th of July, the date of the request of the opening of the projects, and

That the men over 65 and single men be the first under consideration not to be assigned in case of a reduced quota for August.
