The Douglas County Board of Commissioners in special session called by County Clerk T. R. Gerhart, assembled to make a further preliminary study of the annual budget for the County. All the Commissioners and the County Clerk were present.

A list of personal property adjustments for the year 1937, was presented to the Board for its approval and the Chairman's signature before being submitted to the State Tax Commission. Said list was so approved and signed.

Mr. Gerhart brought up the question of repairs for the boiler at the County Courthouse. It was suggested by the Board to advertise for bids for repairs for said boiler, and at this time also ask for bids on coal for the county. Said bids to be submitted on Wednesday August 4. They also requested the Clerk to ask the Sheriff to secure further bids on a set of tires for the Sheriff's car, other than that of Fritz Company, which was submitted to the Board at this time.

Mr. C. J. Dodds and Mr. George Docking a committee from the Chamber of Commerce met with the Board and Mildred LeSuer, County Auditor, to discuss matters pertaining to the County budget.

A Mr. Taylor, Salesman for the Addressograph Company, came before the Board in an effort to interest said Board in purchasing the Addressograph machine for the County.

Mrs. Mildred D. Watson and Leon G. Abele from the Social Welfare Department discussed with the Board and Mildred LeSuer, County Auditor, the preliminary budget for the Social Welfare Department.

The Budget for the County for the year 1938 was gone into by the Board and Mrs. LeSuer. Preliminary study of the budget was not completed, however, and the Board of County Commissioners adjourned until August 2, at which regular meeting, final study and formal approval of the county budget would be taken.

The Commissioners reconvened at this time as the Board of Social Welfare to take up the matter of wages and salaries for the Social Welfare Department.

Resolutions approving the transfer of the personnel of the Relief Department to the staff of Douglas County Social Welfare Department were presented to the Board by Mrs. Watson and approved by the Commissioners. The following is the list of the personnel and compensations of each as set up by the Board:
