

## COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

August 2, 1937.

In the first regular session for the month of August, all the members of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk assembled in the chambers of said Commissioners at 9:30 A. M.

The regular monthly bills against the County for salaries, wages and supplies, and bills for the relief of the destitute, were inspected by the Commissioners and ordered paid as per Allowance Record.

There appeared before the Board Mrs. Mildred D. Watson, County Director and Mrs. W. O. Hamilton, Supervisor of the Sewing Room Project, to discuss the matter of the suspension of the Baldwin City and the Leocompton sewing rooms. Mrs. Hamilton explained that the cessation of the sewing rooms was mandatory, because of the percentage of our cut as set out by the government, on the grounds that the expense of these sewing rooms were too great to allow the continuance of same.

County Clerk Gorhart presented the order from the State Tax Commission granting the reduction in the valuation of the Jonnie Grinnell Farm in Eudora Township.

Bids on a set of tires for the Sheriff's office were presented to the Board. Said bids were opened and carefully scrutinized. Bids follow:

Black moved that the order for the set of tires for the Sheriff's car be awarded to Fritz Company, they being the lowest bidder, for 6 Ply Firestone, using the old tubes if in good condition, at a total price of \$47.60. James F. Brass seconded the motion. On vote, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

At this time final discussion and approval of the annual budget for the county was taken up.

Earl T. Black moved the adoption and approval of the County budget and that the date for the hearing be fixed as of August 16, 1937, at 10 o'clock A. M. James F. Brass seconded the motion and on vote put by Chairman Chris Schaake, all Commissioners voted in favor of the motion.

\$ .15 per column inch in the Eudora News (because of the elimination of composition charge.)  
\$ .65 per column inch in both papers.

Due to the fact that the County is limited for funds, it was deemed advisable by the Board of County Commissioners to print the budget in only one paper this year, that being the official county paper, and to have several hundred copies of the same printed for distribution in the courthouse.
