

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

August 4, 1937.

The Board of County Commissioners met this day in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board, namely: Chris Schaake, Earl T. Black and James F. Brass and the County Clerk T. R. Gerhart present.

Claims against the county for wages, and materials, and claims from the Welfare Department were presented to the Board by the County Clerk, inspected and allowed as per Allowance Record.

County Clerk Gerhart reported to the Board and submitted an order, denying all real estate adjustments that were previously submitted to the Tax Commission for approval. Discussion was gone into and consideration was given to the fact of a rehearing for clarifying this matter. The County Attorney was instructed to get in contact with the Chairman of the State Tax Commission in regard to the above and to ascertain what time a rehearing could be held.

Bids for coal as per advertisement, were received at this time and opened by the Board of County Commissioners.

It being apparent that the Derby Grain Company was the lowest bidder of coal as advertised for, James F. Brass moved that the Derby Grain Company be awarded the contract for coal to be furnished to the County for the month of August and for the 1937 and 1938 season thereafter. Earl T. Black seconded the motion and on vote, put by the Chairman Chris Schaake, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

Bids for repairs on the boilers at the Courthouse and the County Farm were received at this time. Bids for the Courthouse were opened and considered.

James F. Brass moved that the bid of the Lawrence Iron Works, the lowest bidder, for the repairing of the boiler at the Courthouse, be accepted at the total price of \$75.20. Earl T. Black seconded the motion, and on vote, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

It was moved by Earl T. Black that the bids for the repairing of the boiler at the County Farm be referred to the J. R. Holmes Investment Company for their consideration. The motion had a second in James F. Brass, and on vote, all Commissioners voted "Aye".
