Bon Kowing appeared before the Board to request the Board of County Commissioners to release him from a contract, drawin up the 17th day of July, 1929, between the County of Doujlas and Ben and Clara Kowing, which is held on the sand gravel aposit located on the said Ben Kowing's property. Said contract gives the County exclusive right to all sand gravel deposits for a period of 10 years with the privilege of renewing at the expiration of that time for another period of at least 5 years.

Ho also states that damage has occurred to his land caused by a road laid out by the county on this property and that he desires a settlement on such dama gos.

The Board informed Mr. Kowing that they, accompanied by the County Engineer, will view the property at a future date.

Mr. Cerhart, County Clork, presented a letter to the Board written by one Mr. S. L. Rutt, agent for Jonnie E. Grinnell, who makes a request for the refunding of back taxes on the land belonging to the said Mrs. Grinnell.

County Clork, T. R. Corbart, stated that the State Tax Commission made no provision for refunding of back taxes, and the Board of County Commissioners instructed the County Clerk towrite Mr. Rutt and point out this fact to him, denying a refund on back taxes as asked for.

A resolution was presented to the Board for their inspection thereof, sup-porting the Schwellenbach-Allen Joint Congressional Resolution, which is a resolution drawn up for the government to provide work apportunities through the Federal Works Pregress Administration for all unemployed workers, who are unable to find employment in private industry.

It was moved by James F. Brass that the Chairman of the Board be authorized to sign said resolution. Earl T. Black seconded the motion. On vote, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

On a motion, properly seconded and voted, the Board of County Commissioners adjourned.
