

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

In conference with the County Attorney, Charles A. Springer, the Board directed the County Attorney to represent the Board of County Commissioners at the hearing in District Court in Topeka, Kansas, August 30, 1937, in regard to the claim of Douglas County against the Bankers Mortgage Company in Topeka, for taxes on property described as: Lot 71, Elm Street, Baldwin City, Kansas. The taxes on said property ^{are} of eight year delinquency, and said taxes are now due in the amount of \$923.17.

Clifford Harding of the Resettlement Office requested the Board to hire an extra girl for his office for a period of about six weeks in order to take care of a large amount of work that has accumulated. He pressed the dire need of the girl just as soon as possible.

It was moved by James F. Brass that Douglas County provide a helper for the Resettlement Office to take care of emergencies in said office, for a term of not more than six weeks, said term to begin immediately, at the rate of \$12.50 per week. The motion was seconded by Earl T. Black, and on vote, all Commissioners voted in the affirmative.

Glen Flora of Baldwin City, Kansas, came before the Board asking permission to provide transportation for a certain number of school children to go to Ottawa High instead of Baldwin High School, as they would now have to do because of the boundary line drawn between the districts.

The Commissioners discussed the matter with the County Superintendent, Harold A. Fisher, and finally decided to abide by his decision in the matter.

A Mr. Marks, Salesman for the Selig Company of Dallas, Texas, came before the Board to solicit an order for supplies needed in the Courthouse.

The Board informed Mr. Marks to take up the matter with the County Clerk, the Purchasing Agent of the County.

At this time, Mildred LoSuor, County Auditor, presented the approved County Budget to the Board for their certification of the County levy.
